



The Earth Sciences and Lapidary special interest license plate went on sale January 1, 2010.



A \$35 special program fee is charged when the new plate is first purchased; each subsequent renewal will have a \$25 special program fee. These program fees are in addition to all other applicable annual registration fees. All but \$13 of the proceeds from these plates will be transferred by the state treasurer for deposit to the Idaho Gem Club, an Idaho nonprofit organization. The proceeds shall be used to provide classes for

kindergarten through grade 6 to promote understanding about earth sciences and lapidary.

This new plate may be displayed on passenger vehicles, light trucks with a gross vehicle weight of up to 26,000 pounds, motor homes, and camper trailers.

These special plates can also be personalized with up to five letters and/ or numbers. The cost to personalize these plates is \$25 in addition to both the special program fees and all other required annual registration and plate fees. The renewal fee for a personalized plate is an additional \$15 per year.

Individuals can also purchase sample versions of the Earth Sciences and Lapidary plate from the transportation department for \$30 of which \$17 shall be transferred to the Idaho Gem Club. Sample plates can be personalized at no additional cost; these plates cannot be displayed on motor vehicles, but they do make unique gifts for friends and family.

Personalized and sample plates are only available directly from the Idaho Transportation Department's Boise office by either mail, fax, or by using the department's online services which are available at www.itd.idaho.gov/dmv. Application forms for ordering personalized or sample plates can be found at your local county motor vehicle office or online at www.itd.idaho.gov/dmv. Purchasing of the standard sequentially numbered Earth Science and Lapidary plates can only occur at county assessor's motor vehicle offices.

I will practice conservation and undertake to utilize fully and well the materials I have collected and will recycle my surplus for the pleasure and benefit of others .

I will support the rockhound project H.E.L.P (Help Eliminate Litter Please) and will leave all collecting areas devoid of litter, regardless of how found.

I will cooperate with field trip leaders and those in designated authority in all collecting areas.

I will report to my club or federation officer, Bureau of Land Management or other authorities, any deposit of petrified wood or other materials on public lands which should be protected for the enjoyment of future generations for public educational and scientific purposes.


