The club will furnish chili and soup if you would like to bring finger foods we will have a great time cabbing gabbing and sharing some down home companionship.


I will need instructors to come out and help with the instruction for those who are new at cutting the stones. Please consider helping me out with your workshop.



# **Bench** Tips

SAY NO TO OPTIVISORS - from Gary Strickland

Was having my annual vision-check last week and the light-bulb lit up:

why not have my reading glasses made with bifocals that would magnify

the same as the optivisors? So I asked the ophthalmologist if he could

add around +2.00 diopters into bifocals.

He checked with his supervisor and came back all excited. They all

agreed that was a great idea and even gave him a special device to

measure how far I hold a jewelry piece from my eye, so they could get

the focal distance exactly right. So if all goes well, no more sweaty

bulky optivisors! Anyone else tried this?

Yes. I had what was called a stroke a few years ago. One of the lasting effects, even with corrective lenses (eyeglasses), unclear vision. In discussing this with my dentist, she related that her prescription is 2 1/2 magnification and suggested that for close work. Bingo. I can do lapidary and other work now without bulky magnification. Prescription glasses were superior to over-the-counter.

Many people use over-the-counter glass for close work/reading as they are cheap (99 cent store) and do not have insurance, like myself. As we age each eye can have different focus and do not line up correctly. An eye exam can provide a prescription and check for eye diseases like glaucoma. Shop around, I got 3 pair of reading glasses for \$70.00 at Ferris Optical. No tinting or other extras because I just use them for close work. I keep a pair at home, in the car and in the RV. Hope this helps some.

Project can be anything earth science related. Members will cast votes and at conclusion of meeting we will announce the winner. The winners name will be engraved on a special plaque.


