MINUTES OF THE IDAHO GEM CLUB BOARD MEETING JUNE 6TH, 2017

President Dana Robinson called the meeting to order at 7:47 p.m.

Secretary Report: None. Christina Anderton on vacation.

Treasurer Report: Rochelle Eytchison went over the monthly ledger report for everyone. She also received the packet with information about our claims. It will be passed on to Cheryl Link on Tuesday at the picnic.

Federation Report: Linda Barlow reminds everyone that there are 6 spaces left for the Rockhound Retreat over the Labor Day weekend. She also told us that the mid-year Federation meeting will be in Lewiston in October. Exact dates coming soon.

Program Report: Deana Ashton confirmed that the program for this month will be the auction at the end of the picnic. Discussion included table covering paper and update on accessibility to shelter. No damage at that end of the park so everything is good to go.

Juniors Report: Ed Moser wants to remind parents that the Juniors (Rocky Rattlers) need to document what they do on field trips through the summer. They need to write down where they went and what they found. This is needed to support any contest requirements, should they want to enter.

Past Field Trip Report: Brent Stewart led the field trip for July. The area had Leaf Fossils at the bottom of the hill and the Bog Wood site up the road a ways. Aiden, Ashley, and Austin found a nice bird point. Howard discovered a large area with tons of orange/red bog wood for surface collecting and wants to do more field trips to this location.

Future Field Trip Report: Cullen Anderson gave

us the plan for the next field trip out to the Jordan Valley/Rome area to collect snake skin agate. It will be on July 22, meeting at the Gem Stop at 7:30 and leaving at 8:00. It is approx. 114 miles from Boise to Rome. Next month will be the trip to Emerald Creek on Aug. 19 to collect garnets. That trip will leave on Friday for about a 6 hour drive to the campground. There is a charge for camping as well as a small fee for the dig. It was also mentioned that this weekend is Thunder Egg Days in Nyssa, OR. It will run from Thursday July 13th through Saturday July 15th.

Workshop Report: Brent Stewart reported that things are going well at the workshops. He is trying to have instructors concentrate on one area at a time. One person can help with selecting a slab and marking out the cab while another is helping some one-on-one shaping the cabochon, etc. He has several people that are already trained and he will also be announcing an instructor training day in the near future to expand on the number of volunteers who are able to help out. The schedule is working out with a workshop on the Thursday after the meeting and one week later on Saturday.

License Plate Report: Deana Ashton updated us on the progress on getting the license plate reinstated. Marv Hagedorn will be helping with that process. She has also enlisted someone to work on a full-plate design instead of the small logo previously available.

Old Business: We again discussed acquiring a trailer for the storage and transport of the cases for the show. Willa will form a committee to determine costs for a trailer of appropriate size and the costs for fabricating the racks to hold the glass fronts. We also discussed acquiring new tables, some each year, to replace the current tables that are at the end of their useful period.

New Business: 1. Our Guest, Jim Witte, presented an idea for the show sign holders. It is a design that will attach to the back of the table and hold the sign above between two posts. He will be working with Doug Renken to determine the dimensions of the frames and what would be good for the actual signs. Only five will be needed at this time so costs should be minimal. 2. Willa also mentioned that we purchased 100 lbs. of grit for Jim as he tumbles so much for the grab bag table. (See pg. 4)


Map To Picnic





FANCY RIVET HEADS

For a nice looking rivet head, use brass escutcheon pins. You'll have perfectly rounded heads that are all the same size and shape. The pins are a little hard to find, so try the best hardware stores first. Be sure to get solid brass pins, not brass plated steel. If unsure, test them with a magnet.

The pins are readily available online. Lee Valley Tools has them in 14 - 18 gauge and lengths from 1/4 inch to 1 inch. Go to http://www.LeeValley.com and do an item search on "brass escutcheon pin"

For best results, select a drill that gives you a hole with a close fit to the rivet. Trim the rivet to a leave a little less than one diameter sticking out the back side. Place the head on a scrap of hard plastic on the anvil so as to not flatten the head. I prefer a ball peen hammer (with a small 3/8 inch ball) for setting the rivet.

EASIER PRONG SETTING

When setting stones in a prong mount, the tool is less likely to slip off the prong if you grind a groove into its face or rough up the face a bit with sandpaper. Some folks prefer a prong pusher for doing this, and others like a set of pliers.

The easiest way to create a slot on the pusher is with a file, and the easiest way to create a slot on one jaw of your pliers is with a cutoff wheel. Then rough polish the slot with a medium grit, knife-edge silicone wheel.

GEO-GENIUS JUNE ANSWERS

- 1. LIMESTONE: Grey rocks made up mostly of Calcium Carbonate (lime) that can be dissolved slowly by rainwater.
- 2. FOSSIL: Remains or traces of animals & plants that lived long ago, preserved in rock. They can be bits of shells, skeletons, stems or even footprints or tracks made by the animal when it was alive.
- 3. TRACE FOSSILS: Impressions preserved in rocks that were created by an organism that lived long ago.
- 4. GLACIER ERRATICS: Rocks that have been

- transported from their original location by moving ice. They do not belong where found as they differ from the area's normal bedrock.
- 5. PIDDOCK HOLES IN LIMESTONE ROCK: Limestone Rock with holes all over them formed by a shellfish called the Common Piddock (pholas dactylus).
- 6. SHELL MIDDEN: A "dump" of shells left behind by people who lived long ago. On beaches they are often uncovered when the sands that have buried them are shifted by the tides.
- 7. CLASTIC ROCK: Siltstone, Sandstone, and Shale belong to this group of rocks. They are made of sediments and particles from pre-existing rocks.
- 8. MUSHROOM STONES: Water worn limestone blocks which have eroded up to a certain height by the action of former lake water. Therefore, they indicate to us the presence of an ancient shoreline or a seasonal lake.






