SEPTEMBER FIELD TRIP

The field trip for September will be to Haystack Butte on September 20 for some beautiful jasper. We will meet at the elementary school in Nyssa at 7:30 am, leaving at 8 am.

Bring your lunch, lots of water, shovels, rock hammer and buckets. Long pants are recommended to protect your legs from the sagebrush. You will need a high clearance vehicle as it is a lot of rough road. The last bit up the hill requires 4-wheel drive. We can carpool up that section.

BEACON HILL FIELD TRIP

This is the last Beacon Hill trip for the year. Due to scheduling conflicts, it was moved from October 4-5 to September 27-28 so we can have two days to dig. Both days we will meet at the first rest stop in Oregon, just past the Snake River bridge and before Ontario. We meet at 8:00 am and depart in a caravan at 8:30 am.

If people arrive at the entrance to the claim trail, they may NOT enter until Doug or Willa Renken arrive to lead group in all at once.* They will open the gate at 9:00 and take us up to the claim. Do not enter the gate to get a head start, even if it's open! Crossing a lot of private property in a large group takes planning and good relations with the ranchers, which the Renkens do for us. Please wait for them.

You will need a high clearance vehicle, but you can always find someone willing to share their vehicle. Be sure to bring water, lunch, digging tools and buckets.

* The only access to this claim is twice a year on scheduled IGC field trips with the Renkens.



GRAB BAG PATTERN


For those who want to sew up some Grab Bags for the February show, here are the instructions. The Grab Bag Stuffing Party is coming up in mid-January.


Cut out the fabric to 6 1/2" x 9" size. Press down 1/2" on the top edge of each strip. Following the pattern below, fold over the outer edge of the top hem and make the dog ears, then place your drawstring under the hem (but over the dog ears). You may want to place a few pins in the edge of the hem to make sure it stays put before you sew. Then sew the seam.

Once the hem is stitched down (be careful not to catch the drawstring in the stitching), sew the bag, beginning at the opening where you've placed the "dog ears". Stop the needle at about 1/4" from the bottom of the bag, turn and sew to the end. Then cut threads and turn the bag right-side out.

The strings should be made of any heavy cord, yarn or ribbon cut into approximately 14" lengths. Rug yarn is good, strong and colorful. Before sewing, press the folds with a hot iron or crease with the fingers to make the job easier.

The Gem Show for 2026 will be February 21-22. The Caldwell show will be on March 7-8.


Liz filed the claim paperwork for Idaho and Oregon. She requested that we remind her next August 1 so she doesn't forget.
